The data will be used only for internal statistics. The rights guaranteed by the **General Data Protection Regulation (Reg. EU 2016/679 or “GDPR”)** can be asserted in anytime contacting the Office for the Public Relations.

PRIVACY POLICY

This page describes how to manage the website with regards to the processing of the personal data of the users who look it up.

This policy is issued from the articles 13 and 14 of the GDPR in order to protect the personal data accessible on the network from the address: <http://www.cri.it> , which is the homepage of the Italian Red Cross website.

This policy applies only to the website www.cri.it and not to the other websites that the users **could** look up via links.

This policy is also issued from the Advise 2/2001 which the European protection of personal data adopted on 17th May 2001 in order to define the base requirements for the online collection of personal data, and in particular the conditions and the typology of the information to be given to the users when they log on, regardless of their purposes.

DATA CONTROLLER

After the consultation of this site, data referring to people identified or identifiable can be processed. The data **Controller** is the Italian Red Cross, based in Rome (Italy), via Toscana 12, 00187.

PLACE AND PURPOSE OF DATA PROCESSING

The data processing takes place in the above mentioned Italian Red Cross headquarter, and it is managed by technical and authorized staff.

No data generated by the web service is communicated or disseminated.

Personal data provided by users asking for advices or information are only processed in order to perform the tasks requested and they are transferred to third parties only when it is necessary for the above mentioned purpose.

TYPE OF DATA

The IT systems and the softwares, used on this website, acquire, during their usual work, some personal data whose transmission is implicit in the protocols of the Internet navigation.

These data are not collected in order to identify the users, but, by their very nature, they could get to do it through the processing and the association with the data held by third parties.

This class of information includes: IP addresses or the domain of the computers of the users visiting the website, the address of requested resources in URI (Uniform Resource Identifier), the time of request, the method used to submit the request to the server, the size of the file obtained in reply, the numerical code indicating the status of response from the server (successful, error, etc..) and other parameters regarding the operating system and the user's IT environment.

These data are used to be treated only for anonymous statistical information about the website and to check that it is working correctly and immediatly deleting after processing. The data may be used for investigation directed at identifying any persons responsible for actions classed as computer crimes, which are detrimental to the website: apart from this possibility, the data **linked** to web contacts are destroyed after seven days.

DATA PROVIDED VOLUNTARILY BY USERS

The optional, explicit and voluntary email messages sending to the addresses listed on this website and the data transmission for donations involve the acquisition of the sender address, necessary to answer the requests and other personal data included in the message.

COOKIES

No personal user data is acquired from the website. We don't use cookies to transfer personal information or so called persistent cookies or system for tracking users.

The use of so called session cookies (which are stored temporarily by the user's computer and which are normally deleted when the browser is no longer used) is strictly limited to transfer of the session identification data (consisting in random numbers generated by the server) required for a secure and efficient website exploration. The session cookies used in this website avoid the use of other techniques which could compromise users' privacy and do not allow the collection of personal data identifying the users.

OPTIONAL DATA

Apart from the above-described navigation data, users are free to provide personal information contained in the application forms or required in order to contact the Red Cross for requesting material or information.

It may not be possible to process requests if these data are not provided.

PROCESSING PROCEDURES

Personal data are processed by automated equipments for the length of time required to fulfill the tasks for which they were collected.

Specific security measures are ensured in order to prevent data losses, illicit or incorrect use and unauthorized access.

USERS' RIGHTS

The subjects referred to by the personal data collected can exercise the rights **mentioned in Articles 15-21 of the GDPR.**
